Additional Research Information-Miscellaneous

- Your history textbook will **NOT** count as one of your 3 book sources. (However, it may be used as a 4th source).
- ➤ If I have to provide you with books to use during research (i.e. my encyclopedias or classroom books) they will <u>NOT</u> count toward your 3 book sources. However, they may be used as additional resources.
- Sometimes kids' books are helpful.
- When we are ready to use the Internet for sources, do NOT use <u>Wikipedia</u> as a source. Anyone can edit this website. You can use it as a jumping-off point to find RELIABLE and VALID websites.
- When citing websites, create the parenthetical citations like this:

Type whatever information you got from the website and put the author's last name in parentheses with no page number (Smith). If there is no author, simply put the *title* of the website *underlined* within the parentheses (<u>Internet Citation</u>). As usual, the punctuation goes on the outside of the closing parentheses.

Question: Why do we make <u>BIBLIOGRAPHY</u> cards and then create a <u>WORKS CITED</u> page at the end? What's the difference between a bibliography and a works cited page anyways??

Answer: A bibliography is a list of any and all sources used during research. A works cited page is a list of ONLY the works actually cited in the paper.

- Remember: MLA dates are reversed: 1 April 2010.
- ➤ The <u>PROPER MLA HEADING</u> is different than our normal "proper heading." It goes in the top left hand corner of the paper. It is double spaced and looks like this:
